

Clarification of Mobile (Non-Stationary) Use

This document is intended to clarify the definition of "Mobile (Non-Stationary)" use in Soltaro Product Warranties, as well as outline recommendations and requirements for use of the product in any situation that could be considered "Mobile (Non-Stationary)".

"Mobile (Non-Stationary)" use is defined as the unit being installed on a transportable structure that is expected to be transported (post-install):

- 1. More than once per 4 weeks, AND/OR;
- 2. More than 3000km per 12 months, AND/OR;
- 3. Transported on rough roads/tracks, exposed to large amounts of prolonged vibration due to travel.

These scenarios are NOT covered under any Soltaro Product Warranty. If a Soltaro Product has been installed on a transportable structure that DOES NOT fall into any of the above situations, then the standard warranty applies, with the following requirements:

- 1. The Product must be Switched Off at least 1 hour prior to transport.
- 2. The Product must not be Switched On until at least 30 minutes after transport.
- 3. Unless the mounting structure of the Product already provides a securing latch or bolt, the Product must be securely restrained to the mounting structure by use of suitably rated straps or other forms of load restraint.
- 4. All relevant safety and usage documentation is required to be kept with the Product, independent of where the transportable structure is moved to.
- 5. If applicable, all local requirements for the transport of Dangerous Goods must be applied.

While not considered as "Mobile (Non-Stationary)", unless it is otherwise stated, Soltaro Products are not intended to be used in floating or marine applications.
